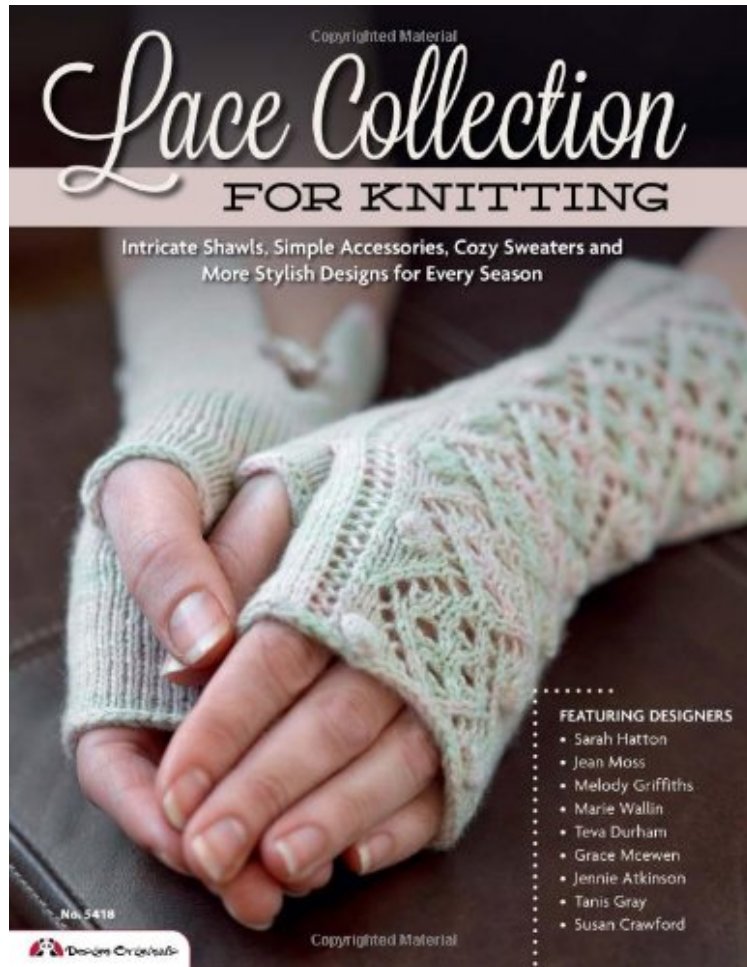

Photography and variety of patterns are excellent. After locating a pattern for shells in Amanda Jones' Dulcie Tunic, I decided to begin with this pattern. Charts

are all incorrect in the following square: Sleeve Chart: Row 11, columns 14 and 40 Central Panel chart: Row 11, column 13 Border Chart: Row 11, column 14. Correct stitch would be K1tbl on RS, P1tbl on WS. Written directions are correct. I can only hope this is the only error in the book and did check the publisher's website for potential notice of print errors.
