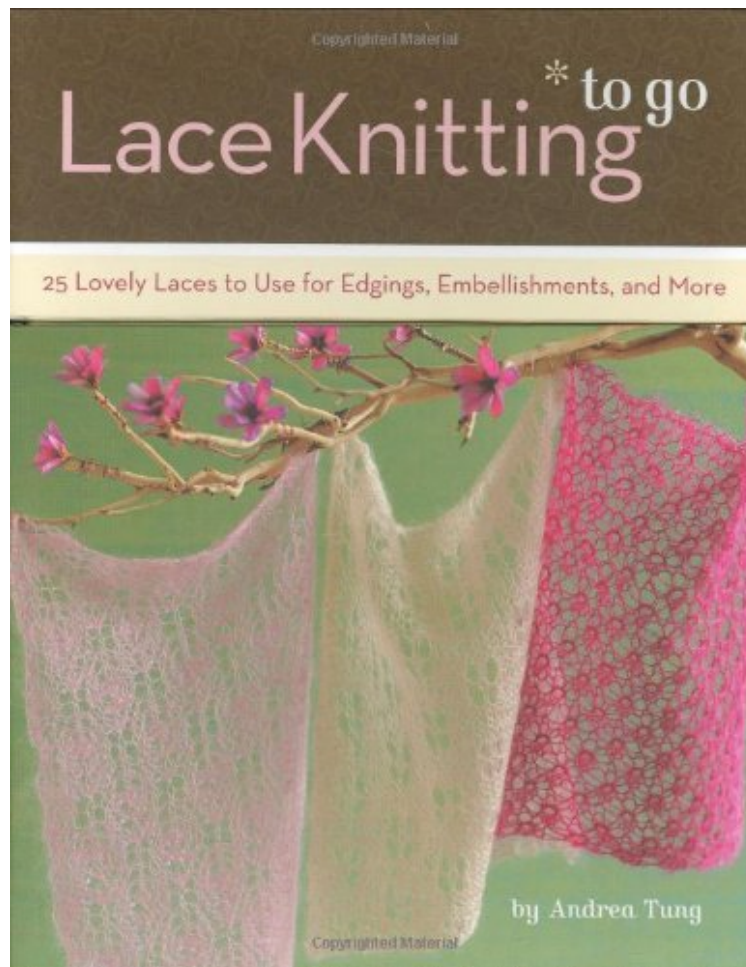

By Delamaine I like to copy out my knitting patterns on 3x5 cards so I can keep them near me while I knit instead of referring to a big book or magazine that will keep falling off the chair. So I really expected this to be a great thing, especially since I'm just now getting into lace knitting. Well, these are nice designs printed on high-quality cardstock in a very sturdy box, with a card of yarn terms (how to do YO and so on), but the problem I find is that the cards are big! Almost greeting-card-sized (though much sturdier), and folded in half. What I mean is that the folded size is almost like a greeting card. The front has a picture of the finished swatch or item, in color (nice pics); the inside of the card has the instructions. So, for me this is not useful; they are still pretty big and will be awkward to have on the couch or the arm of my knitting chair. But it is a nice item. It would be a good gift idea for a knitter because it has nice ideas even though it didn't work for me.
